C.A.P. Meeting Minutes from February 26th, 2018

Meeting was called to order by President Mark McCusker at 7:03pm.

Treasurer Report: The balance as of February 12th is \$29,293.74. This includes \$627.00 in the PayPal account for Hall of Fame tickets and two memberships. Checks that cleared were for KLAAsign updates and for reimbursements for Coaches Corner and the Golf Outing. The profit from Coaches Corner was \$1000.00. This is roughly the same as last year's. Ed motioned and Charisse seconded that the Treasurer Report be approved. The motion passed unanimously.

Meeting Minutes: The January minutes were reviewed. Lisa H. motioned and Mark McConnell seconded that the January minutes be approved. The motion passed unanimously.

Athletic Program: Cheer made it out of Districts and was an MHSAA Regional Qualifier. They set school records for the best scores ever. Pom finished in 7th place in Division I for Mid American Pom. Wrestling had three individual Regional Qualifiers: Drew Bush, Connor McAnalley and Matt Wilson. MHSAA Bowling will officially become a sport in Livonia beginning next Winter. Each high school will have a Boys and Girls team, JV and Varsity. The new school logos have been unveiled and are for public use. All current logos are grandfathered in. Parent/Teacher Conferences are March 15th, 1-3pm and 5-8pm. We would like to have a table for CAP at conferences.

Committees:

Coach's Wishlist: The Varsity Cheer coach, Amanda Weldon, updated that there is a new rule coming into effect in the 2019-2020 school year that will make the current uniforms illegal. Metallics and cutouts will no longer be allowed. The teams will need approximately 28 Varsity and 15 JV uniforms. They are about \$80.00 each. End of May is the best time to start looking for the best price. They have been fundraising, having a bowling fundraiser and a bottle drive. The bowling fundraiser made approximately \$2000.00, and the bottle drive made about \$800.00. They will have two more bottle drives and a car wash. Lisa H. updated that there is \$500.00 remaining from this year's Wish List budget and \$1100.00 from last year's budget. Mark McConnell motioned to use \$1000.00 to go towards new uniforms. Ed seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Brick Program: There is one new brick order. Five bricks will go in in about two weeks.

Old Business:

Scholarship: The new application is up on the website. The deadline is March 29th. Please spread the word to your teams. Danielle asked for volunteers for judging. Lisa Norwood, Mark McConnell, Karen Maladecki, and Dawn Cummins will be judges. Mark McCusker will ask Alan Drake if he is interested. If not, Stacy LeBar will judge.

Hall of Fame Dinner: The date for the Hall of Fame dinner is March 14, 2018. The inductees are Adam Bedell, the 1982 Boys Soccer Team and Coach Rick Austin. It is the same menu as last year, including appetizers. Between 50-60 tickets have been sold so far. Final cut off for tickets is March 9th.

Decals: New logos will be incorporated into the decals. The idea was discussed to sell the old logo decals for \$5.00 and the new logo decals for \$6.00.

Golf Outing: The golf outing is June 10th. Castle Gardens has purchased two sponsorships. Tin Cup will hopefully be the same price as last year. Charisse will have a spreadsheet at the next meeting to start the process of getting donations and sponsors for holes.

New Business:

Questions were asked about possibly rebranding CAP so parents can better understand what it is and what services it provides. Is it confusing to have CAP and CAPA so similar? Do people not understand that CAP is the CHS booster program?

KLAA Track Regionals are the same day as Senior Prom this year.

Karen is asking for clarification from Marc regarding talk of students doing a walkout to protest gun violence in schools: If the administration decides to suspend any students that participate in a planned walkout, what would happen with the student athletes in regards to their sport participation?

Mark McConnell motioned and Mark McCusker seconded that the meeting be adjourned. The meeting was adjourned at 7:50pm.
